

Holy Land Pilgrimage & 9th Annual Women's Encounter

March 23rd - April 1st, 2023

Tentative Itinerary

Thursday March 23rd:

Meet at your hotel in Bethlehem for dinner and overnight in Bethlehem.

Friday March 24th:

After breakfast, we drive to Ein Karem to visit the Church of John the Baptist and the Church of the Visitation. We then visit the Shepherds Fields, the Church of the Nativity, and the Milk Grotto in Bethlehem. Dinner & overnight in Bethlehem. (Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner)

Saturday March 25th:

In the morning, we head to the Mount of Olives in Jerusalem to visit the Chapel of the Ascension, the Church of the Pater Noster, and then Dominus Flevit where Jesus wept over Jerusalem. At the base of the Mount of Olives, we will visit the Garden of Gethsemane and the Church of All Nations where the Lord prayed in agony on Holy Thursday. After stopping at the site of Mary's Tomb, we will proceed up Mount Zion to visit St. Peter's Church in Gallicantu and the Cenacle (the upper room). We return back to our hotel in Bethlehem for dinner and overnight. (Breakfast & Dinner)

Sunday March 26th:

This morning we will go to the Old City of Jerusalem to pray the Stations of the Cross along the Via Dolorosa, beginning at the pools of Bethesda and the Church of St. Anne, and ending at Calvary in the Church of the Holy Sepulcher. In the afternoon we will visit the Exhibit of the Shroud of Turin and the Pentecost Room before returning to our hotel in Bethlehem for dinner and overnight. (Breakfast & Dinner)

Monday March 27th:

Our goal this morning is a visit to Lazarus' tomb, and home of he and his sisters Martha and Mary in Bethany. We then descend into the Judean desert and for a view of the Mount of Temptations before stopping at the Baptismal Site on the Jordan River. We will then drive through the Jordan River Valley toward Nazareth where we will check in to our hotel for dinner and overnight. (Breakfast & Dinner)

Tuesday March 28th:

Beautiful Mount Tabor is our goal after breakfast, where we will visit the Church of the Transfiguration before continuing on to Cana, the site of Jesus' first miracle. In the afternoon, we proceed to Nazareth to spend time at the Church of the Annunciation at the site of Mary's house, as well as the home of the Holy Family in the Church of St. Joseph. We will have dinner and overnight at our hotel in Nazareth. (Breakfast & Dinner)



Wednesday March 29th:

We start the day with an inspirational boat ride on the Sea of Galilee, followed by a scenic drive along the shore to visit ancient Capernaum, Peter's Primacy, and Tabgha, the site where Jesus fed the 5,000. In the afternoon, we ascend the Mount of Beatitudes where Jesus delivered the Sermon on the Mount for some time of prayer, before returning to Nazareth for dinner and overnight. (Breakfast & Dinner)

Thursday March 30th:

Today we check out from our hotel in Nazareth to transfer to Magdala where we will check in and register for the 9th Annual Women's Encounter entitled "Celebrating Feminine Identity: In a World Focused on Gender Ideology, Who Do You Say That I am?" (Breakfast & Dinner)
